In the Program in Multicultural and Global Education, students systematically study multicultural education, peace education, and international development education. Through this program, they acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to build a peaceful society through education.

After graduation, students aim to work in roles that support the practice of multicultural education and peace education in increasingly internationalized schools and local communities, and NGOs/NPOs. They may also pursue careers in international cooperation in the field of education with domestic and international organizations.

Furthermore, students can choose to continue their studies at the graduate level to become specialists engaged in research on multicultural education, global education, peace education, and international educational development and cooperation. In the International Education Development Program of the Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences, approximately 70% of students are international, coming from over 40 countries, and many Japanese students also bring a wealth of professional experience. This diverse and stimulating environment fosters both research and practical skills.
